## PRESIDENTS REPORT – FEBRUARY 2021

MDOS are conducting the New Growers Workshops again this year however there is a change in the format, to provide the new growers with as much exposure to different growing methods and conditions, different cultural ideas etc. each workshop will be hosted by a different experienced grower each month. The 5 workshops will be held on a Saturday afternoon 2pm to 4pm on February 27<sup>th</sup>, March 20<sup>th</sup>, April 24<sup>th</sup>, May 28<sup>th</sup> and June 26<sup>th</sup>.

The first session "Staking of Plants and Inflorescence" will be held at Doug & Eve Penninghs' residence (100 Beach Rd, Sarina), this has been selected as the first talk to provide New Growers with methods and knowledge to assist them in staking their blooms of the Autumn Show.

The remaining workshops will cover:

- What genera grows best in pots, baskets, saucers or mounts;
- Using Insecticides, fungicides and fertilisers;
- Potting demonstrations of various genera and correct method to write your labels;
- Shade house design, layout and set up and watering systems.

Don't be afraid to utilise the Buddy System and contact your allocated Buddy with any questions you may have regarding orchid growing and culture. The list of Buddies is listed elsewhere in the Orchidwise Newsletter, if you are not included in the Buddy System and wish to be included, please raise it with the committee.

The Autumn Show will be held at the Sporting Wheelies Hall on Friday and Saturday March 26<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup>. Show set-up and tabling of plants will be on Thursday March 25<sup>th</sup> commencing at 12 noon. Show entries must be tabled by 2:45pm as Judging will commence at 3pm. As this is our first show in over twelve months, I encourage all growers, novice and experienced, to enter their blooms into the Autumn Show. The only way you can gauge your flowers against other growers' flowers is by entering your blooms into the show. **You will never, never know if you never, never show.** We the growers have been cooped up during 2020, unable to show our plants due to COVID - remember the general public has also been cooped up so let's give them something to WOW over.

\*500 MLS luke-warm water

\*5 MLS Pariffin Oil

\*3-4 drops of dishwashing liquid (I use Morning Fresh)

I only spray early morning or late afternoon, never in the heat of the day. This mixture has been very effective on all plants, ferns and especially the orchids (dens, cats, oncids & phallys).

It stops RED SPIDER, WHITEFLY, SCALE & MEALY BUGS. The best of it is, it's not poisonous!

## Conference & Show

'For the Love of Orchids'

## 1 - 5 September 2021

Planning Committee Update November 2020





It is now only a little over 9 months until the Conference and Show, and although the COVID-19 cloud hangs over us, we

continue to plan for a fantastic event in September. We appreciate that there are many of you who plan to join us, but have been hesitant to commit to registering because you are worried that you will be out of pocket if the event is postponed or you are unable to attend due to COVID-19. I want to assure you that should travel restrictions or event postponement because of COVID-19 mean that registrants are unable to attend AOCC 2021, their registration fees and any other associated payments that have been made to AOC will be refunded in full. However, let me stress that there are presently no plans for any postponement of the Conference & Show (AOCC 2021) and that any such decision would be one made by the Australian Orchid Council Inc. Board of Management. We are mindful that the situation regarding the virus is continually changing, and each time we meet, there are new 'what if' scenarios that we need to consider. One such concern is our overseas lecturers being able to get here, but we are exploring technological options so that they can still be involved if our overseas borders remain closed to them. But even if this is the case, we hope that the borders will be open to our regional neighbours so that they can join us.

#### SHOW SPONSORSHIP AND DISPLAYS

At present we are seeking sponsorship for show classes.

Our show schedule lists about 230 individual classes: 178 orchid classes; 35 cut flower classes for those growers travelling more than 500kms; 4 foliage classes; photography; painting and floral art. And that doesn't include the section champions and overall champions of show! So there will be lots to see and enjoy. Societies, nurseries and commercial growers, and even individuals are encouraged to set up displays of orchids and foliage plants, but orchids can also be benched with others of the same class. We want visitors to experience 'the WOW factor' when they walk through the doors and see the expanse of orchids before them. And of course, it's *Dendrobium speciosum* flowering season, so the room will be filled with perfume. So get your society members organized and start planning a display. It can be as small as 1 tabletop, or as large as a 4m x 4m floor display. There are no points for following the theme of the show, "For the Love of Orchids", but

embellishments and accessories are permissible, as long as the orchids and foliage plants are the focus of the display.

The cost for most classes is \$50 (1<sup>st</sup>-\$25, 2<sup>nd</sup>-\$15, 3<sup>rd</sup>-\$10) and you would be acknowledged on the website as well as at the show.
